Doris J. Deutsch became the Executive Assistant and Legislative Liaison for the Savannah District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in December 2003. In her current position, Deutsch is responsible for planning, coordinating and implementing District events, and for liaison between the Corps of Engineers and members of Congress and their staff. The Savannah District supports 12 Army and Air Force installations in Georgia and North Carolina, and water resource activities in Georgia and portions of South Carolina. The Savannah District performs work nationwide and worldwide in support of military design and construction; master planning; hazardous, toxic and radioactive waste clean-up at Formerly Used Defense sites; real estate activities for the Department of Defense; emergency management operations for state and federal agencies and in support of Overseas Contingency Operations.

During her 29 years of Federal service, Deutsch served in a variety of positions in the administrative management arena. Her previous assignments include working for the Adjutant General at Fort Sill, Okla.; the Directorate of Personnel and Community Activities in Hanau, Germany; and the United States Corps of Cadets at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, N.Y.

Deutsch has spent much of her life in and around a military environment, and has received several performance awards throughout her career. Her professional awards include the Commander's Award for Civilian Service in 2001 and 2004.
