MAJOR (Promotable) DAVID T. LONDON

Major (Promotable) David T. London assumed his duties as Deputy Commander of the Savannah District, United States Army Corps of Engineers, Savannah, Ga., on July 14, 2008. He arrived from the Marne Division (3rd Infantry Division) based at Fort Stewart, Ga., where he served as the Division Engineer Planner and Division Engineer Basing Officer for Task Force Marne's deployment to Iraq from March 2007 to June 2008.

The Savannah District supports 14 Army and Air Force installations in Georgia, North and South Carolina, and water resource activities in Georgia and portions of South Carolina. The Savannah District performs work nationwide and worldwide in support of military design and construction; master planning; hazardous, toxic and radioactive waste clean-up at Formerly Used Defense sites; real estate activities for the Department of Defense; emergency management operations for state and federal agencies; and the Global War on Terrorism.

Major London was commissioned into the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers on May 30, 1992. His first assignment was in the 2^d Engineer Battalion, 2^d Infantry Division at Camp Castle, Korea, where he served as the Assistant Battalion S-4 and a Platoon Leader in Alpha Company. He served at Fort Stewart Ga., as a Company Executive Officer, Battalion S-4, and Battalion Adjutant in the 3^d Engineer Battalion, 24th Infantry Division. While he served as the Adjutant, the 24th Infantry Division reflagged to become the 3^d Infantry Division. After attending the Engineer Officer Advanced Course, Major London joined the 588th Engineer Brigade, 4th Infantry Division at Fort Hood, Texas, where he served as an Assistant Battalion S-3, commanded C Company, and then moved to command the Engineer Brigade's Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment. Major London served as an Assistant Professor of Military Science at Pennsylvania State University's Abington College before returning to Korea to serve as the Eighth (U.S.) Army Engineer Facilities Officer. There he helped plan facilities to move U.S. Forces off the Demilitarized Zone to locations in the southern portion of South Korea. Major London joined the 3d Infantry Division at Fort Stewart, Ga., in June 2006.

Major London holds a Bachelors degree in Economics from the United States Military Academy at West Point, a Masters of Science degree in Engineering Management from the University of Missouri-Rolla, and two Master's degrees in Military Studies from the Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kan. His military education includes Airborne School; Master Fitness Trainer's Course; Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical Warfare Officer Course; the Engineer Officer Basic and Advanced Courses; the Combined Arms Services and Staff School; the Command and General Staff School; and the School of Advanced Military Studies.

His military awards and decorations include the Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (with three oak leaf clusters), Army Commendation Medal (with oak leaf cluster), Army Achievement Medal (with oak leaf cluster), National Defense Service Medal (with bronze star), Iraqi Campaign Medal (one award), Global War on Terrorism Service Medal (one award), Korea Defense Service Medal (one award), Army Service Ribbon (one award), Overseas Service Ribbon (two awards), and the Parachutist Badge.
