Congressman and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to hold water management workshop

SAVANNAH, GA. – The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, in conjunction with the office of Congressman Gresham Barrett, will hold a public informational workshop on drought and water management of the Savannah River Basin, Monday, Nov. 10, at 6 p.m. at the McCormick Middle School, McCormick, S.C. Doors will open at 5:30.

Topics will include long-range weather forecasts, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' drought management plan, and a proposal by Georgia and South Carolina to reduce downstream flows below the current 3,600 cubic feet per second.

Congressman Gresham Barrett of South Carolina plans to participate in the workshop.

Col. Ed Kertis, commander of the Savannah District, along with water management experts, park rangers, weather forecasters, and representatives of state resource agencies will be present to answer questions. Information booths will be open before and after the formal presentation to allow for detailed discussion of water management and recreation issues.

McCormick Middle School is located at 801 Carolina St., McCormick, S.C., on SC route 28, north of Plum Branch.
