**SAVANNAH, Ga.** – [Col. Jeff Hall](#), commander of the [Savannah District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers](#), will hold a news conference at 10 a.m., April 11, 2012, to announce the release of the final reports on the [Savannah Harbor Expansion Project \(SHEP\)](#).

Media should be set up and in place at 9:45 in order to begin the news conference at 10. Please bring identification for entrance to the facility.
