

**Elizabeth (Beth) J. Hilliard, PMP
Executive Assistant and Legislative Liaison**



Elizabeth (Beth) J. Hilliard became the Executive Assistant and Legislative Liaison for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Savannah District in October 2013. In her current position, Hilliard is responsible for planning, coordinating and implementing District events, and serves as a liaison between the Corps of Engineers and members of Congress and their staff.

The Savannah District oversees a multi-million dollar military construction program at 11 Army and Air Force installations in Georgia and North Carolina; water resource activities in eastern Georgia and portions of South Carolina; and wetland protection in Georgia. The Savannah District also performs work in military design and master planning; hazardous, toxic and radioactive waste clean-up at Formerly Used Defense sites; real estate activities for the Department of Defense; emergency management operations for state and federal agencies; and supports Overseas Contingency Operations.

Hilliard began her civilian career with the Corps in 1997 and has held various positions in both the Civil Works and Military programs. Before her current assignment as Legislative Liaison, she served as a project manager for reimbursable operations and maintenance projects with the Savannah District.

Throughout her career, Hilliard has served as a project manager for large-scale military construction projects within the Savannah District and abroad, including Fort Gordon, Fort Benning, and the Corps of Engineers Europe District. Additionally, she served a five-month tour of duty in Baghdad, Iraq, as a program analyst for the Restore Iraqi Electricity mission. Her civil works experience includes serving as an economist with the Savannah District Planning Division, where she worked on complex civil works studies for the Savannah Harbor Expansion Project and the LNG Turning Basin Study.

Hilliard holds two bachelor's degrees in liberal arts and economics, and a master's degree in liberal arts and professional studies from Armstrong Atlantic State University in Savannah, GA. She also holds a current Project Management Professional (PMP) certification. She has completed an array of government-sponsored training in areas of programs and project management, military construction, and leadership—including the Corps' South Atlantic Division Bridge to Leadership program.

Among her professional awards are the Alex Van Hueval Leadership Award, the Savannah District 2006 Charles F. Trainor Military Project Team of the Year Award, the Savannah District 1999 Student Team Member of the Year Award and multiple awards from Toastmasters.
