## Corps to host youth dove hunt at Richard B. Russell Project Sept. 10

**SAVANNAH, GEORGIA** – The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will host a dove hunt for children ages 9 to 15 at the [Richard B. Russell Project Office](#) on Sept. 10. Twelve hunters will be selected to participate in the hunt by random drawing and must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

The hunt is scheduled from 2 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. Parents or guardians accompanying youth participants are also permitted to hunt.

Request letters should include full names of the youth and accompanying adult, age, address, and daytime phone number. Letters must be received by 5 p.m., Sept. 7.

Hunters chosen in the drawing will be notified of their selection on Sept. 8. All selected hunters must report for check-in at the project office before hunting.

Parents or guardians must be licensed in accordance with existing Georgia Game and Fish Regulations, including the Migratory Bird Hunting License (H.I.P). All state regulations and bag limits will be strictly enforced.
