**MAJ Brian J. Tritten
Acting Deputy District Commander**



Maj. Brian J. Tritten assumed his duties as Acting Deputy Commander of the Savannah District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers on April 15, 2011. He arrived from the U.S. Army Student Detachment, Fort Jackson, S.C., with duty in Norfolk, Va., where he attended graduate school at Old Dominion University from August 2009 to December 2010.

The Savannah District supports 11 Army and Air Force installations in Georgia and North Carolina, and water resource activities in Georgia and portions of South Carolina. The Savannah District performs work nationwide and worldwide in support of military design and construction; master planning; hazardous, toxic and radioactive waste clean-up at Formerly Used Defense sites; real estate activities for the Department of Defense; emergency management operations for state and federal agencies and in support of Overseas Contingency Operations.

Tritten was commissioned as an Engineer Officer in June of 2000. His first assignments were with the 41st Engineer Battalion and 2nd Battalion 22nd Infantry Regiment, 10th Mountain Division (LI) at Fort Drum, N.Y. Tritten served as a Sapper Platoon Leader, an Infantry Company Executive Officer, Mine Action Center Executive Officer, and Assistant Operations Officer. While serving in the 10th Mountain Division, he deployed to Bosnia in support of SFOR rotation 10 and to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom 4. After attending the Engineer Captain's Career Course, Tritten joined the 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 101st Airborne Division, Fort Campbell, Ky. in April of 2005. During his time at Fort Campbell, he served as the 2nd Brigade Special Troops Battalion Assistant Operations Officer, Brigade MiTT Executive Officer, Assistant Brigade Engineer, and Engineer Company Commander. While serving with the 101st Airborne Division, Tritten deployed twice to Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom.

Tritten holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Fisheries and Wildlife from Michigan State University and a Master of Engineering Management Degree from Old Dominion University. His military education includes the Engineer Officer Basic Course, the Engineer Captain's Career Course, Sapper Leader Course, Airborne School, and Air Assault School.

His military awards and decorations include the Bronze Star Medal (with oak leaf cluster), Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal (with oak leaf cluster), Army Achievement Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, Afghanistan Campaign Medal, Iraqi Campaign Medal, Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary and Service Medal, Army Service Ribbon, NATO Medal, and the Overseas Service Ribbon (3rd award). He earned the Sapper Tab, Air Assault Badge, and Basic Parachutist Badge.
