
The applicant proposes to construct a private recreational dock similar to all of the adjacent docks on the Wilmington River. Therefore, there will be no fill activities associated with the proposed dock construction.

17. Water Quality Certification: In some cases, Federal law requires that a Water Quality Certification from the State of Georgia be obtained prior to issuance of a Federal license or permit. Applicability of this requirement to any specific project is determined by the permitting Federal agency. The information requested below is generally sufficient for the Georgia Environmental Protection Division to issue such a certification if required. NEWTON'S DOCK SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION
Chatham County, Georgia
Project Description
February 2011

The applicant proposes to construct a new private recreational dock at their property located at Lot 42, Wilmington Estates Subdivision, on the Wilmington River, City of Savannah, in Chatham County, Georgia. The dock would consist of a 6'X75' walkway (6' over an upland bluff, 25' over marsh, 35' over a non-vegetated mudflat and 9' over the river) which would include a 20'X20' fixed deck with a 12'X12' cover; a 10'X14' covered hoist; and a 3'X20' ramp, which would extend to a 10'X20' floating dock. The dock construction would be constructed utilizing best management practices. Typical marine treated products would be used for construction of the dock. Mean Low Water (MLW) to MLW in this area of the Wilmington River is approximately 150' and the proposed dock structure would extend 45' channel ward from MLW. Mean High Water (MHW) is approximately 250' in this area. Water depths at MLW range from 2' to 25' with the channel being more toward the middle to east side of the river. The water depth at the floating dock is approximately 20'. The downstream dock is located approximately 120' and extends channel ward the same distance as the proposed dock. The upstream dock is located approximately 100' and extends channel ward the same distance as the proposed dock. Construction activities are expected to take approximately 2 months and all work would be completed in compliance with any zoning requirements and/or ordinances. Equipment associated with the construction of the recreational dock facility include: a barge and a crane, which would not impede navigation of the channel. No fueling, pump out stations or long term mooring is proposed.

Upland Component: This is a 2.5 acre private residential lot. The area is pervious and is currently maintained centipede grass. The only work proposed on the upland associated with this project is the construction of the 6'X6' (36 square feet) portion of the walkway.

Marshland Component: The proposed walkway would extend over 25' of marsh and 35' of mudflat. The request for a State of Georgia Revocable License and Coastal Zone Management Consistency is also provided as part of this application, which has also been provided to the Georgia Department of Natural Resources – Coastal Resources Division.

Public Interest Review Factors:

1. **Economics/Social:** The proposed private recreational dock construction would not provide economic or social benefits to the general public. Therefore, we have determined that there would be no effect on economic/social concerns as a result of the proposed project.

2. **Education/Scientific:** The proposed private recreational dock construction would provide no opportunity for scientific or educational benefits to the public. Therefore, we have determined that the proposed work would have no effect on education or science.

3. **Aesthetics:** The proposed private recreational dock construction would result in a 6'X75' walkway which would include a 20'X20' fixed deck with a 12'X12' cover; a

10'X14' covered hoist; and a 3'X20' ramp, which would extend to a 10'X20' floating dock. The resulting structure would be similar in design and construction to other dock facilities in the area. However, there would be a temporary short-term impact to aesthetics due to heavy equipment at the site during construction. Therefore, we have determined that the proposed work would have a negligible effect on aesthetic values within the project area.

4. Food/Fiber Production: The proposed private recreational dock construction would be located in the Wilmington River, an area that is not beneficial for production of any food or fiber products. Therefore, we have determined that the proposed work would have no effect on food or fiber production.

5. Historical/Archaeological/Architectural: Historic and/or archaeological resources may be located with the project's area of potential affect. However, no dredging or excavation is proposed in association with the dock construction. Therefore, we have determined that the proposed work would have no effect on historic properties.

6. Recreation: The proposed private recreational dock construction would offer improved access to the Wilmington River and other waterways for water-related recreational activities as well as provide the applicant with convenient storage and boat mooring facilities. However, there are expected to be temporary short-term impacts to recreation during construction due to a barge being utilized in the project vicinity. Therefore, we have determined that there would be a minor beneficial effect to recreation.

7. Land Use: The proposed private recreational dock construction would occur on a private residential lot over open water or unconsolidated river bottom (if during low tide). Therefore, we have determined that the proposed work would have no effect on land use within the vicinity of the proposed project.

8. Mineral Resources: No minerals or other materials are to be dredged, excavated or removed in conjunction with this project. Therefore, we have determined that the proposed work would have no effect on mineral resources.

9. Soil Conservation: The proposed private recreational dock construction would not involve soil loss from the project area, and would not require the input of any soil for fill purposes. Therefore, we have determined that the proposed work would have no effect on soil conservation.

10. Water Supply Conservation: The proposed private recreational dock construction would not require water withdrawals and no withdrawal permits from Georgia Environmental Protection Division, Water Resources Management Branch would be anticipated. Therefore, we have determined that the proposed work would have no effect on water supply conservation.

11, 12. and 13. Water Quality, Air Quality, and Noise Levels: There may be temporary disturbances to water quality, air quality and noise levels while the proposed private recreational dock is under construction. These impacts would subside upon completion of

the project, which is expected to take approximately 2 months. All construction activities would occur during daylight hours (beginning no earlier than official sunrise and ending no later than official sunset). Therefore, we have determined that this project would have a negligible effect on these factors associated with water quality, air quality and noise level values.

14. Public Safety: The proposed private recreational dock would not hinder navigation to and from any adjacent docks nor would it extend further in the channel than neighboring docks. All vessels utilizing the facility would be required to adhere to any safety regulations set forth by both the US Coast Guard and GADNR. Any permit issued by the USACE would include the following special condition: *“The permittee must install and maintain, at their expense, any safety lights and signals prescribed by the United States Coast Guard, through regulations or otherwise, on the authorized facilities.”* Therefore, we have determined that this project would have no effect on public safety.

15. Energy Needs: Construction of the proposed private recreational dock would require minimal amounts of various energy sources, such as electricity, petroleum fuels, etc. These energy sources are readily available and are predicted to be available in the future. Therefore, we have determined that the proposed work would have a negligible effect on energy needs.

16. National Security: The proposed private recreational dock construction is located on waters within the State of Georgia where there are no known or inherent issues with respect to national security. In addition, the area is already frequented by numerous boats and personal watercrafts. Therefore, we have determined that the proposed work would have no effect on national security.

17. Navigation: The proposed private recreational dock would extend into the waterway approximately 45' from MLW at a location where the waterway is approximately 150' wide at low tide. However, there are expected to be temporary short-term impacts to navigation during construction due to a barge being utilized in the project vicinity. Therefore, we have determined that the proposed work would have a negligible effect on navigation.

18. Shoreline Erosion/Accretion: The proposed project does not include any modifications or impacts to the existing shoreline. Therefore, we have determined that the proposed work would have no effect on shoreline erosion/accretion.

19. Flood Hazards: The proposed private recreational dock is not likely to promote a flood hazard or incur significant damage in the event of minor flooding. Therefore, we have determined that the proposed work would have a negligible effect on flood hazards.

20. Flood Plain: The proposed private recreational dock construction is not expected to have any effect on the flood plain. Therefore, we have determined that the work would have no effect on the flood plain within the vicinity of the proposed project.

21. Wetlands: The proposed private recreational dock construction would occur over open water or unconsolidated river bottom (if during low tide). No wetlands would be impacted by the proposed project. Therefore, the USACE has determined that the proposed work would have no effect on wetlands within the vicinity of the proposed project.

22. Refuges: Wassaw National Wildlife Refuge is the closest refuge and is located approximately 3.5 miles southeast of the proposed project. Due to the distance from the wildlife refuge, we have determined that the proposed work would result in no effect to any wildlife refuges.

23, 24, 25. and 26. Fish, Wildlife, Food Chain Organisms and Shellfish Production: Aquatic life in the vicinity of the proposed private recreational dock may be temporarily disturbed during construction, due to the increased activity in the area and minor sediment disturbance caused by the construction equipment. These impacts would subside upon completion of the project. Therefore, we have determined that this project would have a negligible effect on fish, wildlife, food chain organisms and shellfish.

27. Threatened and Endangered Species: No comments were received from the USFWS or the NMFS. Therefore, we have determined that the proposed private recreational dock construction would have no effect on threatened and endangered species.


28. General Environmental Concerns: The environmental concerns for this project were evaluated and discussed above. Therefore, we have determined that any impacts resulting from this project would be negligible.

29. Property Ownership: The uplands associated with the proposed private recreational dock construction are owned by the applicant. Therefore, we have determined that this project would have no effect on property ownership.


30. Mineral Needs: There are no excavation or fill requirements associated with this project. Therefore, we have determined that the proposed work would have no effect on mineral needs.







I am making application for a permit with the U.S. Department of the Army, Corps of Engineers, Savannah District. I understand that the issuance of such a permit will not relieve me of the obligation to obtain authorization from the State of Georgia since the proposed project would constitute an encroachment on the beds of tidewaters which are State-owned property. Accordingly, I hereby request that I be granted a revocable license from the State of Georgia. Attached hereto and made a part of this request is a copy of the plans and description of the project that will be the subject of such a license. I certify that all information submitted is true and correct to the best of my knowledge and understand that willful misrepresentation or falsification is punishable by law.
