

FUDS Program Overview

- The Department of Defense (DoD) has used land throughout the United States for military training.
- DoD obtained property for training and then returned some of it to private or public ownership.
- DoD is responsible for cleanup of environmental hazards associated with DoD use on property that was possessed and transferred prior to October 17, 1986.
- The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) executes the FUDS Program on behalf of the U.S. Army and DoD.
- USACE conducts environmental cleanup at FUDS properties under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA).
- The FUDS Program goal is to reduce risk through effective, legally compliant, and cost-effective actions for activities attributable to DoD.




Map of FUDS Properties




CERCLA Process

Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act






Camp Butner FUDS Property Boundary





Property History

- The U.S. Army established Camp Butner to train infantry, artillery, and engineering combat troops for deployment during World War II.
- Camp Butner was active from 1942 through 1946 and included approximately 15 live-fire ammunition training ranges, a grenade range, a 1,000-inch range, a gas chamber, and a flame thrower training pad.
- Munitions used at the property included small arms, 2.36-inch rockets, rifle and hand grenades, 20-millimeter (mm) through 240mm high explosive projectiles, 60mm and 81mm mortars, and antipersonnel practice mines.
- Camp Butner was closed in 1947, and the property was transferred to the Army National Guard, the state of North Carolina, local municipalities, and private owners.
- Projects 04 and 11 are located inside the Camp Butner Training Center.
 Project 05 is all privately owned and consists of residential, commercial, industrial, agricultural, recreational, and undeveloped wooded lands.




Remedial Actions: Land Use Controls

• The Remedial Actions for Projects 04, 05, and 11 consist of land use controls as selected in the Decision Documents for each project. Land use controls will reduce the risk of exposure to explosive hazards for Army National Guard trainees, construction/utility workers, residents, occupational workers, recreational users, and visitors. Land use controls will consist of:

Educational Pamphlets:

- At **Projects 04 and 11** (within the Camp Butner Training Center), the North Carolina National Guard will distribute Soldier Field Cards to trainees and 3Rs educational pamphlets to construction/utility workers and visitors annually.
- At **Project 05** (within privately owned land), USACE will mail 3Rs educational pamphlets annually directly to the physical address for each parcel and the address of record for each property owner if it is different from the parcel's physical address.





Remedial Actions: Land Use Controls

Warning Signs:

- Warning signs will be on aluminum sheet metal and will measure 18 inches wide by 12 inches tall. They will be installed on support posts where property owners concur.
- ➤ At **Projects 04 and 11**, USACE will install warning signs on North Carolina Army National Guard property.
- ➤ At **Project 05**, USACE will coordinate with representatives from the state of North Carolina and private property owners to obtain rights of entry for the parcels of land on which warning signs will be installed.
- USACE will inspect warning signs annually to ensure they are present and in good condition.

FORMER ARTILLERY USE AREA MUNITIONS MAY BE PRESENT DO NOT TOUCH CALL 911 TO REPORT MUNITIONS

Recognize – when you see a munition and that it is dangerous
Retreat – do not touch it, but carefully leave the area
Report – call 911 to report munitions. Provide your location to the dispatcher.
