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C. Additional comments to support AJD: According to available information described in Section III.A. of this form, these ditches, while exhibiting intermittent flow in some areas, do appear to have historically been constructed in uplands and there is no clear record to support that these ditches relocated or modified a naturally occurring surface water channel. Further, there is no clear evidence to support that these ditches ditches were constructed through an adjacent wetland. Therefore, we have determined that these ditches are best defined under the NWPR as a paragraph (b)(10) non-jurisdictional water.
