B. Typical year assessment(s): Georgia drought monitor data, via the United States Drought Monitor webpage, was prepared by the applicant which indicates that normal climatic conditions occurred throughout the consultant's initial site visit(s) during the week of June 9, 2020. This data further concludes that the entire State of Georgia experienced no drought conditions that week.

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C. Additional comments to support AJD: Based on the Corps site visit, 2 ephemeral stream channels (E1 and E2) exhibited minor evidence of bed-and-bank characteristics with shallow flow patterns (typical of the Piedmont province). Erosional features were present towards the headwaters of each stream reach. Evidence of flow was visible within the ephemeral stream segments, which likely occurs immediately after significant rainfall events and/or during periods of major flow. An AJD was requested by the applicant for the (b)3 exclusion of these resources under NWPR.

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
